Criteria for Award of the Qualification

To achieve the award of the Bachelor of Applied Management, students must pass a total of 360 credits which include:

A maximum of 120 credits (8 courses) at Level 5;
A minimum of 120 credits (8 courses) at Level 6;
A minimum of 75 credits (5 courses) at Level 7.

Year One students will usually complete:

Six Level 5 compulsory management courses (90 Credits);
Two other papers from the options list (30 credits).

Year Two students will usually complete:

Three compulsory Level 6 management courses (45 credits);
Five other papers from the chosen major and electives at Level 6 or above (75 credits).

Year Three students will usually complete:

Three compulsory Level 7 management courses (60 credits)
Four courses (60 credits) from the chosen major - two of these must be at Level 6 and two at Level 7.



Recognition of Prior Learning/Cross Credits from Diplomas

Waiariki recognises prior learning (RPL), whether granted in formal or informal settings. The principles by which relevant knowledge and skills can be granted credit to the Bachelor of Applied Management include:

- No more than 180 credits may be gained through RPL or cross credit. Courses that can be cross credited from the National Diploma in Forestry (Forest Management) Level 6 are marked with an *.
- Credit will be awarded if the learning outcomes match and have been achieved within the past eight years from approved courses or relevant experience. It is the student's responsibility to provide the supporting information for the RPL and credit transfer applications.
- RPL will not be granted for Level 7 courses.
